*Eupteryx petasitidis* Ferrari, 1882 - Fiume Secchia, Sologno (Reggio Emilia, Italy)

***Eupteryx petasitidis* Ferrari, 1882 (Auchenorrhyncha Cicadellidae).** The taxon from Piedmont has been described as *Eupteryx carpini petasitidis*. Later, it was considered a synonym of *E. atropunctata* (Goeze, 1778). Recently (2014), *E. petasitidis* was re-established as a valid species based on a detailed study of coloration and genital morphology. Until now, this species has been found only in the Italian mainland (from Piedmont to Calabria).

Apparently, it is monophagous and lives on *Petasites hybridus* (L.) Gaertn., Mey. and Scherb., and has been found only in rather low altitudes (100 - 800 m) on their host plant in shadowy places near rivers or brooks. Its closest relatives are *E. atropunctata* (Goeze, 1778) and *E. aurata* (Linnaeus, 1758), which both are polyphagous with a wide range of host plants and present in many European countries.

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
